US, ONE CAN EXPECT TO FIND VALID CORNERS TABLISHED IN GOOD FAITH USING MANY METHODS, REE—POINT, TWO—POINT, AND EVEN ONE—POINT NITROL. THIS TOWNSHIP IS CONSIDERABLY SMALLER AN THE GLO RECORD IN BOTH NORTH—SOUTH AND EAST—IN MEASUREMENTS WHICH DIFFER GREATLY FROM THE ORFORD.
